

Sayaka Suzuki's *Drifting Dreamers* invited diverse audiences to consider the word "immigration." These responses were written on upcycled fabric of various shades of blue (to reference the traditional Indigo used in Sashiko, a traditional embroidery technique of rural Japan). These thoughts, fears, dreams, and hopes of the people were stitched together to create a life-sized fiber boat bonded together by the thickness of fabric and structural integrity only attained by its layering effects. This sculpture functions as both a metaphor for this moment in history and the strength of diverse ideas.

These responses have also been transcribed in this zine exactly as they were written. Suzuki hopes that through this idea of sharing personal histories and ideas, people will begin to see the current situation of the world's immigrants with more of an empathetic mindset.


